

Bi-Annual Brush Pick Up (Spring and Fall)

***Please check website for actual pick up dates.**

***Have all brush out to your curb the weekend prior to pick up week:**

- **Spring Pick Up (*actual dates will be posted on website*)**

Beginning on the 1st Monday of May for residents North of Route 64

Beginning on the 2nd Monday of May for residents South of Route 64

Beginning on the 3rd Monday of May for residents in Plato Township

- **Fall Pick Up (*actual dates will be posted on website*)**

Beginning on the 1st Monday of October for residents North of Route 64

Beginning on the 2nd Monday of October for residents South of Route 64

Beginning on the 3rd Monday of October for residents in Plato Township

**** Please note weather or a holiday may delay start times**

Guidelines – see photos for reference

- **Piles must be manageable by one person**
- **Piles no more than 18-24 inches in height**
- **Cut ends faces towards roadway**
- **Logs up to 6 inches thick by 4 feet long**
- **Branches up to 8 feet long**
- **Piles may be tied together using only string or twine (NO WIRE)**
- **Thorny trimmings MUST be bundled and tied using only string or twine**

Examples of acceptable brush:



NO – Clearing of forest floor, Firewood, Flowers, Grass Clippings, Heavy Logs, Stumps, Leaves, Lumber, Plants, Plastic Bags or Containers or Root Balls

*****These will result in your brush getting a Red Tag – see below*****

Red Tag Notices:

Your brush may be tagged for not adhering to the above guidelines. This tag will specify the reasoning behind why your brush was not picked up and the Highway District's phone number to contact us.
